

Moses is still learning that sometimes God allows bad things to happen for a reason – Moses didn't know it yet, but God had plans to totally defeat and dishearten the Egyptians in such a way that they would never be a threat to the Israelites again, and that the whole world would hear about it.

Ellen White writes in Desire of Ages, "God never leads His children otherwise than they would choose to be led, if they could see the end from the beginning, and discern the glory of the purpose which they are fulfilling as co-workers with Him."

Although things looked bad for the moment, when Moses looked back later he would have said, "It was all worth it. The worry, Pharaoh's anger and the peoples complaints were all worth it when I see what God did to our enemies and how He led us."
