NOTE: Feelings are not wrong – they are normal; this includes the feeling of anger. It is what we do when we are angry that can be wrong. We must understand why we are angry and either forgive the person and give the anger to God, or talk to the person and work out a suitable solution that we are both OK with.

When <u>Esau</u> found out that Jacob had <u>tricked</u> him out of the <u>birthright</u> he was very <u>angry</u>. Their Mother suggested that Jacob should leave for a while and travel to Haran to seek a wife from her family, rather than marry a woman who did not love God. This was a good excuse for Jacob to leave and would hopefully give Esau time to forget his anger.

At sundown on the first day of his journey, Jacob lay down using a stone for a <u>pillow</u>. He <u>dreamed</u> of a stairway or <u>ladder</u> that reaching from the <u>earth</u> up to <u>heaven</u>. <u>Angels</u> were going up and down the steps and the Lord stood at the top and said, "I will give the ground where

you are lying to you and your children. Your descendants will be as many as the dust of the earth! \underline{I} am with you, and \underline{I} will protect you wherever you go and one day \underline{I} will bring you back to this land "



The next morning Jacob took the stone he had used for a pillow and setting it upright, poured olive oil over it and named the place Bethel which means "house of God." He also promised to pay tithe and worship God always.

God had forgiven him, but he would still have to live with the consequences of his choices.


In Haran Jacob stayed with his Uncle Laban who had two daughters,

Tuesday


Find your way to heaven through the maze of the ladder.
