Sabbath


Remember how Joseph was taken as a slave to Egypt? He was sold to Potiphar, the captain of the king's guard. What could Joseph do now? He could have:


The next morning Pharaoh called his wise men, but they couldn't tell him what his dream meant. Then the chief cup-bearer remembered Joseph.




