

As time went by, Joseph and his brothers grew old and died, but their descendants, the Israelites had many children and grandchildren.

A new Pharaoh of Egypt, who had never met Joseph was worried by how many Israelites there now were so he decided to make them slaves! But even though they were badly treated, their numbers kept on growing. So Pharaoh gave the order that all new Israelite baby boys must be thrown into the Nile River.

Now Jochebed, an Israelite mother and her husband Amram, gave birth to a baby boy and kept him hidden in the house so that the Egyptians wouldn't find him. But as he grew bigger, it was harder to keep him hidden, so when he was three months old, Jochebed made a basket of reeds, and waterproofed it. She put the baby in the basket and laid it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile River.

After a while the Pharaoh's daughter came down to bathe in the river, she saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to get it for her. When the princess opened the basket the baby cried and she felt sorry for him; she knew he must be an Israelite child, and she decided to adopt him. 



Hebrews 13:5 _{NIV} actually warns about the desire for more money saying, "Keep you lives free from the love of (10a) and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I (7a) you; never will I (3d) you."
Wise King Solomon even observed it saying in Ecclesiastes 5:10NIV, "Whoever loves money never has (8a); whoever loves (5d) is never (1d) with their income."
Instead of worrying and wanting more to make us happy, we should follow the advice of my favourite verse, Philippians 4:6, 7 _{NLT} "Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank Him for all He has done. Then you will experience God's ⁷ (6d), which exceeds anything we can understand.
