They complained to everyone about Moses and Aaron and finally challenged Moses: "What right do you have to act as though you are greater than us? We are all holy people!" Two hundred and fifty members of the council also supported them.

Moses was dismayed; he reminded Korah that he already had special job in the Sanctuary, "Isn't that enough?" Then he told them that they, along with Aaron, should bring their censers to the Lord on the following morning.

The council members and a large group of people gathered the next morning, but Korah, Dathan and Abiram refused to come. Then the Lord said to Moses, "Tell all the people to get away from the tents of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram."

So Moses rushed over to their tents and cried. "Quick! The Lord has said, 'Get away from the tents of these wicked men.' He will give us a sign to show He has sent me:

As the people watched, the ground suddenly split open beneath the tents, and swallowed the men, everything they owned and all their followers who were standing with them. Then the earth closed over them, and they were gone.

At the same time, fire came from the Sanctuary and burned up the 250 council members with their censers!

This week we will learn more about God by learning more about Jesus.


Colossians 1:15-23 tells us several important things. Have a read through it today.
