


Sunday

When the Israelites arrived in the wilderness of Zin, Miriam, Moses' sister died and was buried there.

Once again there was no water for the people to drink and they blamed Moses, saying, "Why did you make us leave Egypt? We are going to die here; there is nothing to drink and nothing to eat!"

The Lord said to Moses, "Take your staff and call the people; go to the rock over there and speak to it and water will come from it."

So Moses took his staff and called the people to the rock. But Moses was angry, so instead of speaking to the rock he yelled at the people, then he hit the rock twice with the staff, and water gushed out. But the Lord said to Moses, "You did not obey Me in front of the people of Israel, so you will not be the one to lead them into the Promised Land."

Moses sent a message to the King of Edom asking permission for the Israelites to travel through his land, but the King refused, so once again they had to turn around and take a longer way.

Then God told Moses and Aaron it was time for Aaron to die; Moses helped Aaron remove his High Priest's robes and put them on his son.

After mourning for thirty days, the people of Israel continued their journey, but they began to complain again. Then the Lord stopped protecting them and poisonous snakes came into the camp. Many of the people were bitten by snakes and became sick and died. Then the people went to Moses and said, "We have sinned. Please pray that the Lord will stop the snakes."

The Lord told Moses to make a snake of bronze and attach it to a pole. God said, "Anyone who is bitten by a snake, and looks at the bronze snake will be healed."

This was to remind the people that one day Jesus would die on the cross and that Jesus is the only way to be saved from sin.

Friday

Everything in the Sanctuary was designed to reflect or teach about something important.

- The burnt offering represented Jesus sacrifice on the cross.
- The blood represented Jesus' blood, which was given to cleanse us from sin.

The Day of Atonement when the earthy Sanctuary was cleansed also represents real events, some of these events have already occurred, some are occurring now, and others are still to happen.

• One goat represented <u>Jesus</u> who died and gave His <u>blood</u> for our sins.

• One goat represented <u>Satan</u> who will eventually be

condemned and removed.

Being angry is not a sin - it is a normal part of being human. Becoming angry should motivate us to do something about whatever is wrong - not to do something else that is wrong.



Have you ever felt that younger children get away with more than you do? Do your parents say, "You should know better." A person who should be more responsible will often have greater punishment than someone who is younger. The same is true for leaders in a position of responsibility.

Monday

The Altar of Burnt Offerings was located in the courtyard of the Sanctuary and, like the snake on the pole, reminded the people that Jesus would one day die for sin. This is where the various sacrifices were burnt, including the daily sacrifices for the sins of Israel and the personal sacrifices that people brought as sin offerings.



The Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur in Hebrew, occurred in autumn on

the tenth day of the seventh Jewish month. On this day the High Priest would remove his colourful robes, wash, and dress in pure white. He would offer a ram as a burnt offering and then sacrifice a bull as a



sin offering for his family. Taking the blood of the bull, and a burner of incense, the High Priest would enter the Most Holy Place to sprinkle the blood in front of the atonement cover or mercy seat of the Ark.

Two male goats would be presented to the Lord, and lots cast to determine which would represent the sacrifice of Jesus.

This goat was killed, and the High Priest sprinkled its blood above the atonement cover of the Ark before burning its body on the Altar of Sacrifice.

The other goat was called the scapegoat and represented Satan. The priest put his hands on that goat and confessed Israel's sins. Then the priest sent the goat into the wilderness, never to return. One day Satan and sin will be gone from this world, never to return.


