

When the other kings heard about what had happened to Jericho, they prepared an army; but the people of Gibeon did something different. They loaded their donkeys with worn saddlebags

> and old, patched wineskins; they put on worn-out sandals and ragged, patched clothes, and they took bread that was stale and mouldy.

They said to the Israelites, "We have . come from far away to make a peace treaty with you."

The Israelites said, "God has said we cannot make a treaty with those who live nearby."

But the Gibeonites answered, "When we left home, this bread was fresh and these wineskins were new, and our clothes and sandals were good, but now they are worn out from our very long journey."

So the Israelites made a peace treaty with them.

Three days later, the Israelites learned that the Gibeonites lived only three days travel away! The Israelites had promised they wouldn't fight them; some of the Israelites didn't want to keep their promise but the leaders said, "We promised before God so we must keep our promise."

Then Joshua asked the Gibeonites, "Why did you lie to us? Why did you say you lived far away when you live right here?"

They replied, "We that the Lord your God has given this entire land to you, so we were afraid for our lives. That is why we have done this. Now we are at your mercy; we will do whatever you say."

So the Gibeonites became the woodcutters and water carriers for the Sanctuary.



<u>Monday</u>

Each week this term, we will be learning more about one of the Ten Commandments. Write out the words of Exodus 20:16.

Depending on which version of the Bible you have it probably said testify or witness - words which we don't use a lot in ordinary

talking any more; but they are still used in courtrooms. If a person witnesses (sees) an accident or a crime happen, that person may be called on to testify, (tell about) what they saw; they are called a witness.



Exodus 20:16 is actually the 9th Commandment and it is telling us not to say things that are false - not to lie.

The Gibeonites lied about where they came from; as a result, although they were allowed to stay with the Israelites but not in the way they might otherwise have.

Read Exodus 23:32. God had warned the Israelites not to live among or make treaties with idol worshipping nations because if they did, they would turn to idol worshiping too. But foreigners who gave up idol worship and followed the laws of God could receive the same blessings as the Israelites!

Remember Rahab? She had helped the two Israelite spies and asked to be saved when Jericho was destroyed. As a result, all who took refuge in her house - she and her family - were saved and Rahab is even mentioned in the linage of Jesus in Matthew 1:5. Who else is a foreigner in the same verse? _ _ _ _ _

If the Gibeonites had approached the Israelites honestly and sincerely, and they truly wanted to follow God, they could have had the blessings of the Israelites without becoming slaves.


