


"We Want A King!"

The king will take your daughters and force them to cook and bake for him. He will take the best fields and give them to his own officials. He will charge you a tax from your grain and your grape harvest; he will demand you give the best of your cattle and donkeys for his own use. You will be his slaves." The people said, "We still want a king, we will be like everyone else."

Now a man named Saul was searching for his fathers' missing donkeys. Samuel met Saul and told him the donkeys had been found; then he gave a feast in Saul's honour. The next day Samuel anointed Saul and told him he would be king. Saul did not believe Samuel, but Samuel told Saul exactly what would happen on his way home and everything came true just as Samuel had said.

Later Samuel called the people of Israel to meet. He cast lots to show who would be king, and they found Saul hiding among the bags.




