



# Sunday

Remember how King Saul had offered the sacrifices himself because he wanted the Lords <u>blessing</u> on his army, when he should have <u>waited</u> for Samuel? Samuel said, "You have <u>not listened</u> to God! Now He has chosen another leader for His people!"

One day, Samuel said to Saul, "The Lord has commanded that you totally destroy the Amalekites who have caused so many <u>problems</u> for you; everything must be destroyed."

So Saul took his army and attacked as commanded, but they captured the Amalekite king and <u>saved</u> the best of their animals.

When Saul saw Samuel the next day, he made excuses saying, "The animals are to be a sacrifice." But Samuel told him, "Obedience is

better than sacrifice; because you have rejected the commands of the Lord, He has rejected you and chosen a new king."

When Saul heard this he finally admitted that he had <u>sinned</u>



and asked to be forgiven; he <u>begged</u> Samuel to return and worship the Lord with him. Samuel turned to go and Saul grabbed his coat and it tore. Then Samuel said, "The Lord has torn this kingdom from you and given it to someone who is better than you."

Samuel did return with King Saul, they worshipped the Lord and then Samuel executed the Amalekite King, Agag. After that they each returned to their separate home towns and Samuel never met with King Saul again.

#### Friday

Have ever heard of someone having a test in obedience or honesty? A banker might leave someone who is asking for a job sitting in a room with some money, and then watch on a camera to see what they do; sometimes a boss will dress up as a customer, or have a friend pretend to be a customer to make sure the workers do the right thing. Perhaps the Sabbath is a test to see if we obey even if we don't understand.

#### **Thursday**

Have you ever noticed that many of the laws of the land are based on the Commandments, like the laws about stealing and killing? I'm sure parents want their children to honour them and it's easy to see that adultery, lying and coveting hurt people too.

The first four Commandments help us to build and keep a close relationship with God, but although all Christians agree that spending regular time with God is important, some ask why the Sabbath? Or more to the point, why Saturday?

Some say, "I'm going to have Sabbath everyday, not just on Saturday." But what does God tell us we should be doing on the other six days? Read Exodus 20:8-11 if you can't remember.

Can you imagine what it would be like if you celebrated your Birthday every day of the year? It might be great a first, but would it still feel special after a month, or after a year. It would become normal rather than special.

Other people say, "I believe it is important to have a special day with God, but it doesn't really matter what day." What if someone important was coming to visit at your church or school and you said, "It doesn't matter what day I go to meet them." If you didn't go on the day they tell you to, you would miss out.

The reason for the details of most of the other Commandments seems obvious and logical – they make sense. The reason why Sabbath must be Saturday is unclear except that, that is what God said to do. We obey God because we love Him, not because we understand or even agree with what He wants. Use the missing words from the first half of Exodus 20:8-10 NIV to solve the crossword.

Then Samuel met Abinadab; but again God said "He is not the one." God said the same thing for each of Jesse's seven sons.


Finally Samuel asked, "Do you have any other sons?"

#### Tuesday


