

When the other Canaanite kings heard that the Gibeonites had made a peace treaty with Israel, they brought their armies together and attacked the towns of the Gibeonites.

The Gibeonites sent a message to Joshua, "Please come at once and save us! The Amorite kings have joined together to attack us."

This time they asked the Lord who said, "Do not be afraid for I have given you victory over them; they will be able to stand up against you."

Joshua and his army travelled all night and took the Amorite armies by surprise. God made the Amorites panic and the Israelites chased them; then God sent hail to defeat even more of the enemy soldiers. But Joshua saw that the sun would go down before they could finish, so

he prayed to the Lord, "Please let the sun stand still over Gibeon and

the moon stay over the valley of Aijalon."

Then the sun and moon stayed in place and did not set until the Israelites had defeated their enemies.

The Bible says, "There has never been a day like this one before or since, when the Lord

answered such a prayer. Surely the Lord fought for Israel that day!" Joshua $10:14_{\rm NLT.}$ On that same day they captured and cleared all the towns from Kadesh-barnea to Gaza and from Goshen to Gibeon - much of the southern land of Canaan.

When the kings in the north heard what had happened they banded together to attack with soldiers, horses and chariots - so many they could not be counted, but the Lord promised victory to Joshua.

Joshua and his army travelled to meet them near Merom and God gave them victory over their enemies.

So the Israelites took possession of a large part of the Promised Land.

Friday

The things that we pray for are not always the best things for us, even though it might seem that they are. We can't see the future so we can't see if something will have a bad influence on us and lead us away from God, or perhaps the thing we want is faulty and would cause us a lot of problems, or something might be about to change so that we won't want it anymore. Only God can see the future, and since we know that He wants what is good for us, we can trust His decisions.

We should pray like Jesus did. Lookup what He said when He taught the disciples how to pray in Matthew $6:10_{\text{NIV}}$


"Your _ _ _ be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

He said the same sort of thing again, when He prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane the evening before He died. Luke $22:42_{\text{NIV}}$, "Yet not my _ _ _ , but yours be done." – In other words He was saying "You decide" or "Do whatever You think is best" or "I want what you want."

When we add something like that on our prayers, we allow God to do what is best for us. Even when bad things happen, it will be because God has allowed them and they are the best thing for us in the long run.



The tribes of Reuben and Gad, and half of the families from the tribe of Manassah had chosen to settle in the Promised Land east of the Jordan River. Now it was time for the remaining tribes to receive their territories. Caleb who had spied the land with Joshua more than 40 years before requested the hill country where giants still lived.

The remainder of the land was divided by drawing lots as the Lord had commanded.

When Reuben, Gad and the families from Manassah had settled on the east of the Jordan River, the men of fighting age had come to



help capture the rest of the Promised Land, now they were allowed to go home but before they crossed the river, they stopped and built a large altar.


When the other tribes heard about the altar they were horrified, since God had commanded that once they entered the Promised Land, sacrifices must only happen at His chosen place. (You can read this command in Deuteronomy 10.) They immediately gathered to fight the eastern tribes, but decided to send a group ahead to demand an explanation. They were very relieved when the people from Reuben, Gad and Manassah explained that the altar was not to be used for sacrifices, but to be a reminder that the tribes on the east and the west of the Jordan were all a part of God's chosen people.

God told Joshua not to be afraid. What did God say?




