The power of the Pope and the church leaders continued to arow until by the thirteenth century, everyone one feared the anger of the system - even kings bowed to and obeyed the Pope rather than face the consequences. Most Church leaders were corrupt; true Christians and anyone who dared to disagree were martyred. The progress of civilisation in the Roman world stopped; learning in the arts and science fields was prohibited and the Bible seemed lost.

But as with the early Christian church, the persecution also pushed the true Gospel of Jesus further; it spread to Britton: England, Scotland and then Ireland. When the Saxons from Germany. Denmark and The Netherlands invaded the Brittons, they brought idol worship again, but a school of true Christianity was established on the island of long in the Hebrides off the coast of Scotland, and from here missionaries went out to spread the Gospel to not only Britton, but Germany, Switzerland and Italy.

The most famous missionaries of this time were the Waldenses. They had a copy of the Holy Scriptures and while the rest of the Roman Empire was led astray, they rejected idol worship and kept the Sabbath. They lived, hidden in a secret valley among the mountains in Italy right in the heart of the Roman Empire! Children



were taught to be very careful in what they said, to work hard and most importantly, to love the Word of God. Young people also spent time making copies of parts of the Bible, often working in caves.

Yet they did not stop there; instead, when a young person had learned all they could at home, they were sent to a school or university in France or Italy to learn more but also to if possible to share hidden pieces of scripture with those who were open to truth.

To become a minister, a young person was required to serve three years as a missionary - a dangerous thing in those days. Instead of working openly, they posed as merchants or peddlers; they would sell their goods and when given the opportunity, share the scriptures with their customers. In this way the true Gospel was kept alive and even spread throughout Satan's territory, although many of these missionaries and those who believed them became martyrs; Satan was not successful in destroying the truth.

News of the king's wisdom spread throughout the land; even to foreign lands. When the queen of Sheba heard, she came to see for herself. She was amazed at Solomon's wisdom and his wealth. She left saying "It is all true. You and your people have been blessed by your God."

What is wisdom? The World English Dictionary says wisdom is the "ability to think and act utilizing knowledge, experience, understanding, common sense, and insight." Wisdom helps a person make good decisions and the opposite of being wise is to be foolish.

The Bible has a lot to say about wisdom: Solomon himself wrote, "Get all the advice and instruction you can, so you will be wise the rest of your life," and "wisdom can save your life." Proverbs 19:20, Ecclesiastes $7:12_{NLT}$

But even Solomon, as wise as he was, didn't always make wise choices. Unfortunately, he followed his father's example in marrying multiple wives. 1 Kings 11:1 mentions Pharaoh's daughter from Egypt, Moabites, Ammonites, Edmonites, Sidonians, and Hittites. How many wives does 1 Kings 11:3-8 say Solomon had? And what happened because of it.

Because Solomon worshipped idols, God said that trouble would come to Israel, although the worst didn't happen until after Solomon's death. But Solomon found out that worldly wisdom without God, made life seem meaningless; you can get a good sense of this by reading the book of Ecclesiastes which he wrote.
