We have been learning about the dark ages when Satan tried to destroy the Bible and almost succeeded. The few copies of the Bible that still remained were written in Latin, a language only taught to university students. Without the Bible, people couldn't tell right from wrong and were easily deceived.

At this time the Pope was to calling people to join monasteries as a sign of their love for God and when they joined, they were not allowed to leave. The monasteries were given the rights to hear confessions of sins and forgive sins; they did not work but were supported by the payments and taxes.

Even the Apostle Paul had a trade and of course God is the only one who can forgive sins, but without access to the Bible, many were led astray. What was Paul's trade? Read 2 Thessalonians 3:8; Acts 18:3



John Wycliffe was born in the fourteenth century in England and he was a keen student, studying both the laws of the land and religious studies at Oxford University. Here he had access to a Bible and began a through study of it.

In the Bible he found the real Jesus and the truths about God's plan of salvation.

Some educated people had tried to reform the monasteries, but they had failed. Now John Wycliffe began to write tracts – booklets, showing what was wrong with the monasteries and saying the entire

system was false and should be stopped and that the Pope did not have the power to forgive sins, nor the right to demand taxes from the people.

He also wrote about the teachings of Jesus and people, even some priests began to doubt what was taught by the priests and to believe the truths of the Bible.

A New House for God

Sabbath

It had been King David's dream to build a permanent <u>temple</u> for the Lord, but God had told him that his son Solomon would build it instead. But before his death David started collecting materials and making preparations for the building. David gave Solomon many instructions; he said, "The temple to be built for the Lord must be <u>magnificent</u>; it must be <u>glorious</u> and <u>famous</u> and bring <u>honour</u> to the Lord's name. Follow the Lord your God with all your heart and soul, and build the sanctuary of the Lord God so that you can bring the Ark of the Covenant and the <u>holy</u> vessels from the tabernacle into the Temple."

David ordered the leaders of Israel to help Solomon with the project, and he opened up his own <u>treasure</u> houses and gave gold and <u>silver</u>.

And others did likewise, donating gold, silver, bronze, iron and <u>precious</u> stones. The people were glad and gave freely for the Lord.

Now Solomon ordered the men of Israel to help with the building of the temple. He sent 10,000 men at a time to Lebanon to help cut trees for it, they worked for one month, then returned home for two months before returning to work again. He sent 80,000 to the quarries to cut and prepare the stone, and 70,000 to help carry.

But no tools were used at the temple site; all the stones were cut <u>perfectly</u> at the quarry before they were brought to the temple so that the building site was quiet!

The Holy and Most Holy places in the new temple were a copy of the original <u>designed</u> by God. These were surrounded by various courtyards, rooms and verandas.

The inside walls were lined with cedar and carved with pictures of <u>angels</u>, palm <u>trees</u> and <u>flowers</u>. The walls of the inner sanctuary itself were lined with <u>gold</u>. The doors were carved in the same way.

It took seven years to complete the temple and then they placed the Ark of the Lord in its place, and the light of God filled the temple. With the people of Israel watching, the king prayed a prayer of dedication for the



temple, also asking God's patience and blessing for all the people.

After that Solomon also built himself a grand palace which took thirteen years to complete. You can read a description of it in 1 Kings 7 which also has a description of the interior furnishings of the temple.


And so Solomon took seven years and built a grand temple for the Lord.
