Last week you learnt about John Wycliffe who preached the truth and wrote many booklets about the Bible in a time when Satan's control was very strong and religious freedom was virtually unheard of. As you can imagine, he soon came to the notice of the Pope and other leaders of the church who decided that he must be stopped; but God had other ideas.

The first time he was called before a council of Bishops (church leaders) in England, he was accompanied by two important princes and the courtroom was filled with people supporting him so they let him go. Then the Pope died and two rival Popes were elected – each claiming to be God, and calling the other the antichrist! So there was civil war in the church and John Wycliffe was left alone.

Now John was not content just to preach and publish the truth, he decided to translate the entire Bible into English so that the people could read for themselves.

But before he could finish, he was struck down by a serious illness; representatives from the church came to his death bed telling him he was dying because of his sins; but he suddenly told them that they were wrong and he would not die! And that is what happened.

At last the first English Bible was finished. There was no printing press in those days, so writers immediately set to work copying it by hand. There was so much demand for it that they couldn't keep up. Some rich people bought a copy of the entire Bible; many people bought parts of the Bible and often a group would combine together to purchase a copy to share.

Nearly half of the people in England accepted the truth! Now Satan renewed his effort to kill John Wycliffe and John fully expected to become a martyr. Three times he was called before different courts, but each time the Spirit of God came on him and he spoke with such power that the court couldn't say or do anything. When he did die, it was as a free man in his own church.

God did not bless John Wycliffe with money, with an easy life or even with good health; but he was blessed by God's protection of his life, by the satisfaction of doing a great work for God and sharing the good news of salvation with more people than we will ever imagine.

<u>Sunday</u>

King Solomon knew that his great wisdom came from God but still, he did not follow God in all matters and it led both him, and the whole nation of Israel, into trouble. Instead of having only one wife who was also a believer in God, the Bible says "He had seven hundred wives of royal birth and three hundred concubines, and his wives led him astray." 1 Kings $11:3_{NLT}$ In fact, the Bible says he even built temples for the gods of all of his foreign wives!

God promised David that his family would rule forever; but when Solomon worshiped idols, God said they would lose part of the kingdom.

One day the prophet Ahijah met Jeroboam, who was in charge of Solomon's workers. Ahijah took off his new cloak and tore it into twelve pieces and said, "Take ten pieces for yourself, for God says that He will tear part of the kingdom from Solomon's son and give you ten tribes. If you obey as David did, He will make you a great nation."

When Solomon heard, he tried to kill Jeroboam.

Solomon eventually turned back to God but the damage had already been done. When Solomon died his son Rehoboam became king; Rehoboam didn't love God and after listening to the advice of his friends he determined to be a tough king, forcing the people to work even harder for him and making them pay more taxes. He refused to listen to the advice of the elders. The ten northern tribes rebelled and chose Jeroboam to be their own king, and the kingdom was spilt in two. Rehoboam called Judah and Benjamin to fight, but God told them not to and they obeyed.

For seventeen years, Rehoboam led Judah away from God and he built many idols. While he was king, Egypt raided and carried away gold and jewels from the temple of God. After Rehoboam, his son Abijah ruled three years and after that Abijah's son, Asa became the king, but unlike his father and grandfather, Asa loved and followed God. During this time there was war between Judah and Israel.

<u>Friday</u>

God has promised to bless all who follow Him, but the blessing of one person may not be the same as the blessing of another. Some people are blessed financially; some people are blessed with a long life or a good family. Others are blessed in ways that allow them to do a special work for God. <u>Monday</u>

The history of the northern tribes is even worse. Jeroboam did not want the ten tribes to travel to Jerusalem to worship; he feared they would reunite with Judah, so he set up altars and two golden calves for the people to worship. He created festivals and chose new priests.

One day as he was preparing to offer a sacrifice, a man of God came from Judah to say that a descendant of David would sacrifice Jeroboam's priests on his own altar and that the altar would split apart as a sign. As Jeroboam pointed and cried "Seize him!" the altar split in half and Jeroboams hand froze and shrivelled up - still pointing! When Jeroboam asked, God restored his hand; but still he did not change his evil ways and God finally warned him that his family line would end.


Jeroboam's son Nadab became king, but he ruled only two years before Baasha from Issachar killed him and all their family. Baasha was king for twenty-four years but he also worshiped idols so God sent word that his family would suffer the same fate as Jeroboam's. Baasha's son Elah reigned only two years before Zimri, an official, killed him and crowned himself king. Then Zimri killed all of Baasha's descendants just as God had foretold. Zimri was king only seven days before the army of Israel crowned Omri. Some people wanted Tibni to be king but Omri's army proved stronger than both Zimri and Tibni's supporters. Omri ruled for twelve years and was followed by his son Ahab. They all rejected God and worshiped idols.

During David and Solomon's time, the kingdom of Israel had been a powerful force; they defeated their enemies and grew riches; Solomon had built the beautiful temple and palaces. When they were following God, everything they did succeeded. Now, the kingdom was divided; most of the people had forgotten God; they spent many years fighting amongst themselves and their enemies raided them and stole their riches. The kingdom of Israel was no longer something to be admired, no longer a witness for God.
