Jerome was born in Prague and also studied at the University there; later he went to Oxford University and when he returned to Prague he brought the writings of John Wycliffe. Jerome became good friends with John Huss and worked with him after he returned to the Bethlehem chapel.

The war within the church had continued; now three Popes vied for the top spot and the Emperor called a council - demanding the popes come as well as John Huss. Jerome promised Huss that if he ran into trouble, he would come to help. Before travelling, John secured the promise of safe passage; but soon after his arrival he was thrown in jail. The three Popes were removed, one thrown in the same jail, and a new Pope chosen.

When Jerome heard of John's arrested he set out to help, but soon realised he could do nothing and had needlessly put himself in danger. He was arrested on the way home and also thrown in jail.

Many pleaded for the release of Huss, especially since the Pope had been found guilty of all that Huss had accused him and more. Instead John endured a series of trials, before being condemned to burn to death. As they took his clothes from him, he reminded them of how Jesus was mocked; as they placed a paper crown with pictures of demons on his head, He blessed Jesus who had worn a crown of thorns. He finally died singing to Jesus.

The council decided they must make Jerome confess his sins and so he was chained in a dungeon cell and fed nothing but bread and water for a year so that he nearly died. When he was finally brought before the council he was so weak that he agreed to obey them and to say they were correct in condemning Huss and Wycliffe.

But back in his dungeon cell, he remember Jesus who had suffered and died for him, he realised the council would not stop until he had also rejected Christ. When he next stood in front of the council he took back his former agreement and claimed the right of a dying man to speak his defence. He prayed for God to speak through him and that is what happened; many of those listening were greatly affected by what he said. Jerome also died, singing to Jesus.



One day Elisha was ploughing in his father's field, when the prophet Elijah walked past and threw his cloak over Elisha. Elisha ran after him and said, "let me say goodbye to my family and then I will come with you." So Elisha became the Prophet Elijah's assistant.

Now Ben-Hadad, King of Aram brought his very large army to Samaria, where King Ahab had his palace; first he demanded Ahab's gold, silver, wives and children, but he was not satisfied. A prophet came to Ahab and said that God would help the Israelite army; so the Israelites defeated the Arameans but Ben-Hadad fled on horseback and the prophet told Ahab to expect them back the following year.

Meanwhile the advisors to Ben-Hadad said, "Perhaps the Israelite god is a god of the hills - next spring we must attack him in the valley."

When spring came the prophet came again to Ahab and told him the Lord would again defeat the Arameans to show that He was the God of the whole world. 100,000 Aramean soldiers died that day and when the rest fled to a nearby city, God caused a wall to fall down killing another 27,000! King Ben-Hadad hid and sent a messenger to King Ahab begging for his life and Ahab agreed. But God was not pleased, He had had other plans of King Ben-Hadad and He sent a prophet to tell Ahab.

Some time later, Ahab wanted to buy the vineyard next to his palace, but Naboth did not want to sell it. Queen Jezebel saw that Ahab was upset and promised to take care of the matter. On her orders, a celebration was called in Naboth's home town and two liars accused Naboth in front of everyone of cursing God and the King. Then they stoned Naboth to death so Ahab could have his vineyard. But God sent the prophet Elijah with a message to Ahab, "Because you have done this evil thing, I will bring an end to your family."

At this time, there was peace between Israel and Judah, and Jehoshephat, king of Judah visited Ahab. Jehoshephat was the son of Asa and he loved God as his father had done.



While Jehoshephat was visiting, Ahab suggested they combine armies to recapture a city; he called 400 prophets who all said the plan was a good one. Jehoshephat ask if there was not a prophet of the Lord. "There is," said Ahab, "But I hate him - he always has bad news."

At first the prophet Micaiah spoke in a sarcastic voice, saying they should go. Then he said Israel would be like sheep sent home without a shepherd because the king would be killed. He said, "I saw the Lord sitting on His throne saying, 'Who can entice Ahab to battle so he can be killed?' And a spirit said, 'I will - I will cause all his prophets to speak lies.' And the Lord said 'go.'"

During the battle a randomly shot arrow hit King Ahab, and by nightfall, he had bled to death, just as Micaiah had prophesied.

Ahab's son Ahaziah became the next king, but he worshiped idols and only ruled two years. When he was injured, falling from the upper room in his palace; he sent messengers to the temple of the idol Baal-zebub to ask if he would recover, but on the way they met Elijah who said, "Why are you asking an idol? Suddenly a chariot of fire appeared, pulled by horses of fire! It drove between Elijah and Elisha, and like a whirlwind carried Elijah into heaven.






Wednesday

One day the leaders of the town of Jericho came to Elisha and said "We have a problem; our town is set in pleasant surroundings, but the water is not good to drink." Elisha asked them to bring a new bowl of salt. Then he went to the spring and threw the salt into it. They tasted the water and found it was now pure and sweet!

Another day, as Elisha was walking along the road, a large group of boys began mocking and making fun of him. "Go away, baldy!" they chanted. Suddenly two bears came out of the woods and chased and mauled them. So Elisha continued to travel around, doing the work of the Lord.
