
In Matthew 24:6, 29 Jesus said that before He returns, "There will be famines and earthquakes in various places... The sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light..."

One memorable earthquake and tsunami happened in 1755. Its centre was closest to Lisbon, Portugal but its effects were seen in Spain, Europe, Africa and America and the shaking felt as far away as Greenland, the West Indies, Norway, Sweden, Great Briton and Ireland. The map shows the travel times of the tsunami – each line is one hour. Mountains were changed and villages disappeared. The earthquake occurred on the Catholic All Saints day - Halloween. There was the sound of thunder underground followed by shaking. People fled to the churches and to a new



guay (wharf) but then most of the large public buildings, including all of the churches and a quarter of the houses fell down and the new augy also sank. Fires broke out in the city and the water from the ocean disappeared then returned in a wave 20-30m high! 60,000 people died that day and many people thought the end of the world had come.

25 years later, on 19 May 1780, many people in America thought the end of the world had come when the sky became black and the sun disappeared; the full moon when it finally became visible later that night was a blood red colour. The day was so dark that people had to use candles to see. Scientists think it was caused by smoke from forest fires but without TV or radio to spread the news people found it very scary.

Of course the Lisbon earthquake is only one of many devastating earth quakes that have occurred in the last couple of centuries; some scientists say that natural disasters are increasing although others disagree; but the world population and the number of people living in cities is increasing so the effects of natural disasters are often more devastating. TV cameras are always ready to broadcast the latest disaster to the whole world so we are certainly more aware of them.

In his third year as king, Xerxes of Persia held a big celebration at his palace in Susa; the celebration lasted 180 days and all the princes, nobles, officials and military officers were invited. After that the king held a banquet for tall the people in the fortress of Susa. This banquet lasted seven days and on the seventh day he sent for Queen Vashti to join him, but she refused. This was unheard of in Persia; the law said that the king's commands must be obeyed! So Vashti was banned from the palace and plans were made to choose a new queen, and officers went throughout the lands, choosing the most beautiful young women to come to the palace.

Esther was a Jewish girl living in Susa; when her parents had died, her older cousin Mordecai had adopted her. Now Esther was among those chosen to come to the palace. For twelve months the young women were given training and beauty treatments in preparation for meeting the king. When the day finally came, the king loved Esther more than all the other women, and he chose Esther to be his queen! The king placed a crown on Esther's head and gave a royal banquet in her honour.

One day after Esther had been made queen, Mordecai overheard two of the king's men plotting to kill the king. Mordecai passed a message to Esther, and Esther told the king.

Some time later, the king promoted a man named Haman, making him the most important officer in the land. Haman liked being important and liked having everyone bow to the ground as he passed by. 


The chart shows the number of people who have died from famines in each decade according to ourworldindata.org/






