 - From https://www.bbc.co.uk/history/historic figures/nero.shtml (leading up to the destruction of Jerusalem) Meanwhile, the Roman empire was in turmoil. Nero established Armenia as a buffer state against Parthia (Iran), but only after a costly war. There were revolts - in Britain (60 AD - 61 AD), led by Boudicca, and Judea (66 AD - 70 AD). In 65 AD, Gaius Calpurnius Piso led a conspiracy against the emperor and in the purge that followed, a number of prominent Romans were executed, including Seneca and his nephew, the epic poet Lucan. In 65 AD, Nero is believed to have kicked his wife Poppaea to death. His next wife was Statilia Messalina, whose first husband Nero had executed. In 68 AD, the Gallic and Spanish legions, along with the Praetorian Guards, rose against Nero and he fled Rome. The senate declared him a public enemy and he committed suicide on 9 June 68 AD. Disputes over his succession led to civil war in Rome.
 - o Discuss how these signs are present in the world today.
 - Talk about or watch a youtube clip of false Jesus' and false prophets etc.
 - Put ticks in the Jerusalem and World columns to show these things apply to both situations







The Fnd of Jerusalem

The end of Jerusalem came 70 years after the death of Jesus. Jesus had warned them that it would come.

Roman soldiers under the leadership of Cestius surrounded the city, but then they withdrew and the Jewish army chased after them. The Christians recognised the signs that Jesus had given and obeyed His warning to flee immediately to a place of safety.

The Jewish army triumphantly returned, but not for long. The Romans returned and laid siege to the city, which was full of visitors for the Passover. Many, many people starved to death, they tried eating their leather sandals and belts. At the same time, other people horded food, keeping it all to themselves. The people had rejected God and God had left them, now they fought like animals, thinking only of themselves, not even caring about their own families.

The Roman leaders begged the Jews to surrender, promising to save the city and temple, but the Jews refused and cursed them.

Right at the end, the Roman leader Titus commanded his soldiers to save the temple. But during the night some of the Jews hiding in the temple and they attacked the Roman soldiers. Someone threw a burning torch into the temple courtyard and it caught alight. The whole temple complex went up in flames and smoke as if it was a volcano and the Roman leaders lost control of the army – more than a million Jews died that day and not one stone of the temple was left on another – just as Jesus had warned.
