
When Jesus came to Capernaum again, the news quickly spread that He was back. Soon the house where He was staying was so packed with visitors that there was no more room, even outside the door.





Would he have been healed if his friends had given up trying to get him close to Jesus? - He had to act on his faith and do whatever he could to go to Jesus. His actions proved that he had faith, and when Jesus saw his faith, He gave him what he really wanted, forgiveness of his sins.

James 2:14_{NLT} says, "What good is it, dear brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but don't show it by your actions? Can that kind of faith save anyone?" And in verse 17, "So you see, faith by itself isn't enough. Unless it produces good deeds, it is dead and useless."

This term we have been learning about the Armour of God. Ephesians $6:16_{\text{NLT}}$ says, "Hold up the Shield of Faith to stop the fiery arrows of the devil."

What sort of fiery arrows does the devil shoot? If faith produces good deeds, then perhaps the fiery arrows are things that stop us from doing good things.


For example, things that distract us from doing what we should: bad friends, bad TV shows and books. Tiredness, doubts, discouragement, and
