Summary: Wise men from the East study and follow the star to find Jesus. The priests in Jerusalem are not interested, the king is angry but pretends to be helpful. They follow the star to Bethlehem and find Jesus.

Read Before: Luke 2:8-21

Aim: We should be excited about Jesus.

Game: Have a small object (eg. a clothes peg). Have most of the children leave the room while one child hides the object. It must be "hidden" where it can easily be seen without moving or touching anything. The other children then come to find it. When they find it they don't tell anyone where it is but sit down and say **"I looked and found"**. Play a few times.

Ask: What were we looking for?

Ask: What did you do to try and find it? – eg. walk around look up and down etc. **Say:** Today we will learn about some men from another country who were looking for Jesus.

Watch the My Bible Friends DVD of Baby Jesus, and then tell about the wise men visiting Herod.
