Have you ever watched a Mum, kiss her child better? Or a Dad, tell his child that everything will be ok?




Belts are worn for many reasons. The left column shows reasons you might wear a belt, the right shows benefits of truth. Draw lines from the left to the matching reason on the right (Hint: Look for the matching words.)

- Decoration or looks: A belt can make a plain outfit look good; people will say "Your outfit stands out and I like it."
- A belt can show status: Many uniforms have belts; the belt shows that the person belongs to the group. Sometimes different belts show what level a person is on.
- Hold your clothes: To hold up your pants or hold in your shirt or dress. If you weren't wearing a belt your hands might be busy holding your clothes. The belt frees up your hands to do whatever you need to do.
- Some belts hold things: like a tradesman's belt. Have you ever seen a carpenters or an electrician's belt? Imagine if they had to carry all their tools in their arms? Their belt allows them to do what the need to efficiently without having to go back and forth for more tools.
- Some special belts are for safety or protection: A Roman soldier's belt was part of his body armour and protected his stomach and thighs; a seat belt protects you in a car accident and a safety harness protects when abseiling or working in high places.

- Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life." Trusting in Jesus and studying our Bibles so that we know the truth will protect us from Satan.
- God's way of truth is always the best and most efficient way to do things. Some people say, "The end justifies the means." They say, "I can lie, as long as it is helpful." But this is not God's way.
- A true Christians will be known for their truth and honesty. We show that we belong to Jesus by our truthfulness.
- People who tell the truth, and who are honest, <u>stand out</u> in this world; people will notice them and <u>like</u> what they see.
- When you always tell the truth you will have a clear conscience, you will be free to do whatever you need to do. People who are burdened by guilt often make poor choices because they are worrying about the past or worried about what people will think.

some fault in the way Daniel was handling government affairs, but they could not find anything to criticize or condemn. He was faithful, always responsible, and completely trustworthy." That is why they tricked the king into signing the law that put Daniel in the lion's den.


Some people say that it does not matter what I do, as long as it turns out OK. They say it is fine to lie, steal, or cheat, if the end result is a good. They say, "The end justifies the means." But this is not God's way. The Ten Commandments do not say "You must not steal - unless you are stealing something because you are hungry or to give as a gift to someone." - They say, "You must not steal." - As in never, not for any reason. (Exodus 20:15)

In Romans 6:1, 2 Paul says "Well then, should we keep on sinning so that God can show us more and more of His wonderful grace? Of course not! Since we have died to sin, how can we continue to live in it?" Christians should always choose truth. This is part of the Armour of God - the Belt of Truth.


