Then I saw in my dream, that they soon saw the town of Vanity before them where a year round fair is kept, called Vanity Fair. They scourged him, buffeted him, cut his flesh with knives; after that, they stoned him, pricked him with their swords; and last of all, burned him at the stake. Thus came Faithful to his end. 



As they went back down the mountain, Jesus said to them, "Don't tell anyone about this until after I have been raised from the dead."



The man cried, "I believe, help me overcome my unbelief!"


