Jared slipped in behind the two men and followed them to see what would happen. The men walked briskly ahead, into the next village. And sure enough – there was a colt tied to the railing. They undid the rope and just as they were leading the young donkey away, a man ran out of the house and angrily yelled, "What do you think you are doing with my colt?" Quietly the two men turned, looked at the owner and replied, "The Lord needs it." And with that – the owner shrugged, turned and went back inside his house. Jared was amazed.

Jared followed the huge crowd back up the Mount of Olives to where Jesus was patiently waiting. The disciples took off their thick outer robes and put them on the donkey as a saddle. Then Jesus calmly sat on it. Jared had watched the taming of a donkey a few weeks ago. It had been very exciting. He was not sure what to expect with an unridden donkey – but had not expected the young donkey to quietly walk along, especially with all the excitement and noise around him.

Outer clothes were laid on the road in front of Jesus. Jared wondered how the owners of the garments might feel if the donkey decided to lift its tail and make a mess on their clothes? People sang and then a chant began to grow amongst the crowd. It got louder and as the whole crowd joined in:

Blessed is he who comes.

Glory in the high places!

Five hundred years before, Zechariah had said this would happen and here it was! Surely Jesus would throw the Romans out now. Many in the crowd had been healed by Jesus. They were so happy to shout His praises.

But some of the Pharisees in the crowd told Jesus to calm everybody down. It was disgraceful they said. Jesus smiled and told them that if the people didn't cry out – then the very stones they were walking on would instead.

As they came over the crest of the last hill and saw the magnificent temple, Jesus stopped. The crowd also stopped. Jared was close enough to see that Jesus was crying. Were they happy tears or sad tears? Everyone went quiet. Almost to Himself, Jesus said, "O Jerusalem, if only you could have made different choices. I can see into the future when the city and the people will be captured, massacred and destroyed."

Jared could not make sense of that. Even the Romans had given money to refurbish the temple. It was God's temple. It had to stand forever. What had begun as a very special, exciting day had just turned completely upside down.




