Even when the disciples were paired up in groups of two and sent off on their specific work, although Judas seemed excited about the healing and casting out of demons that he did on behalf of Jesus, but Jared wondered about the negative influence that Judas might have had on his associate. Or perhaps the other man had tried to help Judas as they worked together?

There had been that time at the feast of Simon when Mary Magdalene had poured that whole bottle of expensive perfume over Jesus' feet. She was honouring Jesus. Simon had not been impressed. And when Judas had seen a year's wages "wasted," in his opinion. The word was that Judas thought it should have been used to help the poor.

Jared had been dozing as the trial of Jesus went on through the night. Suddenly he heard a loud voice and looked up startled. The tall figure of Judas pushed his way to the front clearly distressed. 


Judas was a businessman; he was very good at making money.
