Together they stood in their living room and watched the dawn streak across the sky as they had many times before. But it was different this time; it would be the last time. They had spent most of the night in study and prayer and had come to some very serious decisions. Today, he would not go to work, she would not do her daily chores. It was time to take refuge. It had been a difficult decision. They had each lived their life in relative luxury. Neither of them had ever had to miss a meal or sleep without shelter. They were affluent people in their community, well known and respected. They had a daughter and a new granddaughter.

Now it was time to choose between their world and their beliefs. For the first time they found significance in not becoming too attached to material things. But there was no time for second thoughts. They packed a suitcase with only the simplest necessities and hurried away on foot after pausing a moment to take one last look at their lovely home to which they would never return. It harboured many pleasant memories. They knew it would be looted, maybe burned. With tears in their eyes, they hurried on.

They had known this time was coming, seen it coming for years. First there were heated political debates. Next, the nation was split into warring factions. Their national leaders were forced out of office. Finally, one side – the wrong side – took total power.

Things happened rather quickly after that. Almost overnight it seemed. The sequence of events was alarming in its rapidity. It left no time to ponder or doubt.

As they hurried along some neighbours called out. "Alarmists! Go home and relax!" Others prepared to fight. "We have rights, and we must defend them!" they said. Still others, like them, were seeking refuge. Some ran in fear wondering what they would

eat and where they would sleep. But others trusted the Lord to provide.

As they hurried along they wondered what would become of their daughter, granddaughter, and other loved ones? Would they ever see or hear from them again? Did the place of refuge exist? Could they get there? Was this the Lord's will or panic? The streets of the city were a scene of mass confusion. Nameless faces milled about, cursing and yelling. Children cried. Stores were looted. They tried to work their way through the crowd and onward toward their destination.

Their initial plan was to get to the coast. As they got closer, the crowd became thicker and more hostile. Suddenly the suitcase containing their last belongings was pulled from his hand. He turned to retrieve it only to see it tossed to the top of a truck where two men tore it open and searched it for valuables. He ran forward to protest, only to be roughly pushed back. They hurried on without it.

By nightfall the coast was in sight, but it seemed impossible to penetrate the churning crowd to get there. They longed for the simple security of their home. They held hands tightly, with the knowledge that if they became separated, they might never find each other. Somehow, they had to make it to the place of refuge.



Had the time of trouble come? There is no doubt of it in the minds of those Seventh-day Adventists evacuated from South Vietnam. But they know their flight is not done. For now, they pray and ask that the Lord will continue to provide for them, that He will dry their tears and care for the loved ones left behind. They know He will." "The day that the prophet Daniel wrote about is coming. When you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, you will know the time of destruction has arrived. Then those in Judea must flee to the hills, do not stop to get anything, and pray that your flight will not be in the winter or on the Sabbath. The words of the prophets will be fulfilled. But, no one knows the day or hour when these things will happen, not even the angels in heaven. Only God the Father knows. It will be like before the flood, with people partying and having weddings; they did not realise what was happening until the flood came. It will be like the days of Sodom and Gomorrah, when fire and burning sulphur rained down from heaven and destroyed them all. Remember Lot's wife.

Do not let your hearts be dulled by partying, or the worries of life. Don't be caught unaware. This day will be like the springing of a trap. If the homeowner knew when the burglar was coming, he would be watching to stop him. Be ready for the Son of Man will come when least expected.

The end of Jerusalem came 70 years after the death of Jesus. Roman soldiers under the leadership of Cestius surrounded the city, but then withdrew, and the Jewish army chased after them. The Christians recognised the signs Jesus had given and obeyed His warning to flee immediately to a place of safety.

The Jewish army triumphantly returned, but not for long. The Romans returned and laid siege to the city, which was full of visitors for the Passover. Many, people starved to death, they tried eating their leather sandals and belts. At the same time, others horded food, keeping it for themselves. The people had rejected God and God had left them, now they fought like animals, thinking only of themselves, not even caring about their own families.

The Roman leaders begged the Jews to surrender, promising to save the city and temple, but the Jews refused and cursed them.

Titus commanded his soldiers to save the temple. But during the night Jews hiding in the temple attacked the Roman soldiers. Someone threw a burning

torch into the temple courtyard, and it caught alight. The whole complex went up in flames and smoke as if it was a volcano and the Roman leaders lost control of the army – more than a million Jews died that day and not one stone of the temple was left on another – just as Jesus had warned.
