Jared tucked in behind them as they walked briskly into Jerusalem. He watched as they talked with a man carrying a water jar, then turned and followed him back to his house. Then Peter and John disappeared up to the top floor of the house to an open room. Jared could see them re-arranging the furniture and organising the traditional Passover meal.

The evening shadows were falling as Jesus and the rest of the disciples approached that house. Jared was thankful mum had given him permission to be late tonight. Then he realised the normal servant to wash each person's feet was missing, which was odd. Usually he was stationed right as you walked in the door. So Jared crept closer till he could see better. Nobody was looking out for a small boy.

The disciples seemed unhappy with each other. Jared had heard the mutterings, "Who do they think they are – trying to get better positions in Jesus' kingdom?"

Jesus looked sad, very sad. The disciples must know they had overlooked getting a servant to wash their feet, but none of them would be the first to offer. Jesus spoke quietly telling them the greatest are those who serve and put others first. Then to everyone's amazement Jesus stood up, wrapped the towel around himself and began to wash the disciple's feet!

Watching, Jared could tell Peter objected at first, but then changed his mind and looked happy. Jared crept even closer so he could hear better. He heard Jesus talk about the importance of serving others. Of loving others. Of following His example. Of even suffering just like He was about to suffer.

Then Jesus said some incredible things. They passed around the big chunks of unleavened bread. Whenever you eat this special meal together, think about that. In fact, what we are doing tonight will replace the Passover ceremony for those who believe in Me."

Jesus then passed around the grape juice, and as they drank, He said this would be the very last time He would drink grape juice until they were reunited in heaven. He told them the juice represented His blood being shed to let them have the gift of salvation. Then Jesus made a startlina claim. He said one of the men sitting in the room had already betrayed Him! There was a horrified look from the disciples. "Who would even think of doing that?" came the question. Jesus seemed to brush it aside and casually mentioned whoever puts their hand in the basket of bread with Me, is the one. While that seemed a really powerful clue - the disciples missed it completely when Judas absent-mindedly reached in and helped himself to some bread. It became even more pointed for Judas, because Jesus quietly murmured to him, "Get on with what you are going to do!" Judas seemed to look up apprehensively and then nodded and excused himself from the group. None of the disciples appeared to be curious. After-all, Judas was the Chief Financial Officer for the group. They may have thought he probably had to go and pay the owner of the house for the use of the Upper Room tonight. But Jared had heard it all. Judas was up to no good. He was not sure just what, but he had never trusted Judas. There was just something about him that Jared did not like.

Jared started when all the disciples began to quietly hum and then broke into a song. It looked like the evening was winding up. So much to think about.


The disciples had prepared the special Passover meal for Jesus, but when they all sat down, they found there was no servant to wash their feet.

As they were eating Jesus said "One of you eating with me will betray me." They each asked Him if they would be the one. When Judas asked, Jesus told him "Yes." Then Judas left them.
