The following testimonies are from steps-to-personal-revival.info:

A German woman found had found the Hope Channel on TV and was impressed by what she heard, including about the Sabbath. One day when she was going to visit her mother, she had the impression that they should walk a different path. Then she saw the sign of the Adventist Church. She remembered the Adventists from the Hope Channel and attended the worship service the next Sabbath. Then she invited her husband along, and then her mother. All three have been baptized now.

Another experience relates to a Russian-German sister. She had participated in the 40days devotional time and began to pray for her Russian-speaking neighbours. When she told a neighbour that she was praying for her, this lady was very surprised and told her that she was looking for a church that keeps the Sabbath according to the Bible. She and other neighbours came to the evangelistic meetings and two of them were baptized.

Testimony from Dwight Nelson on steps-to-personal-revival.info:

A young man gave me the book Steps to Personal Revival (available for free from the website steps-to-personal-revival.info). Little did I know this short book would end up dramatically changing my life—the way I pray, the way I preach, the way I relate to others—it has changed my ministry.

Nobody ever told me or taught me that the Bible teaches us to DAILY ask God for a fresh baptism of the Holy Spirit. How could I have gone this far through pastoring and preaching and never learned so compelling a truth! By the time I returned home from that camp meeting I had read the book—in fact I have now read it four times. And my life is changed—you can ask the woman I live with and the people I pastor.

For years I have preached on receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit—series of sermons on this vital theme. But now I've discovered a way to meet with Jesus every morning and do just as He did every morning with the Father—ask for a fresh baptism of His Spirit. Humbly I testify that God has increased the quality of my prayer life. I used to spend much time in the Word and a comparatively short time in actual prayer. Now my practice is reversed—I spend much time on my knees in my early morning prayer closet in communion with God and then turn to His Word for His communication with me. My preaching has gained a new freedom and intensity. My leadership with my team and my people is even better. Suddenly coincidences are multiplying—it's as if someone is arranging my days and nights, my "chance" meetings and emails and conversations. It's as if the Holy Spirit is personally directing my waking hours (even my sleeping ones). In fact, I've come to know Him as a very personal and truly dear Friend.

Why am I telling you this? I have nothing to gain from this testimony—but I am deeply convicted that you do. Jesus is coming soon. We still have a world, an entire generation, to reach with the everlasting gospel. We simply cannot accomplish that mission on our own. Our only hope is to learn what Jesus knew, to practice what Paul and the first disciples lived. We must have the DAILY baptism of the Holy Spirit upon our lives and ministry. And the only way we will have it is if we humbly daily ask for it.

I don't know who you are, but I am praying for you as I write this. The promised Gift is yours and mine for the asking. After all didn't Jesus promise us: "If you then who are evil know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who [Greek—daily, continually] ask Him" (Luke 11:13)? Won't you join me in that daily asking.



Sunday


A great wave of persecution began after Stephen's Many believers fled from Jerusalem, but everywhere they went they told the good news about Jesus.

Philip asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"


The man replied, "How can I, unless someone teaches me? Please come and join me."

What happens if I stuff up?



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

As soon as he believed, the Ethiopian treasurer wanted to be baptized. But what does baptism really mean?


One way of looking at baptism is like a wedding. Two people meet, spend time together, fall in love and get married to show everyone that they are fully committed to each other and planning to spend the rest of their lives together. When a person is baptised they are fully committed to God and planning to spend the rest of their life with Him



The way the ceremony of baptism is performed also has significance. Many churches today say they 'baptise' babies by sprinkling water over them, but this is not how the Bible talks of baptism.

Matthew 3:13-17 tells us about Jesus being baptised by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Verse 16 says "As soon as Jesus was baptised, He went up out of the water." Since He comes 'up and out' He must have gone 'down and in' to the water before.

Going down into the water can be a symbol for being dead and buried. When we are baptised, we say that our old sinful self has died, like Jesus died on the cross. When we come up out of the water, we say we are being resurrected or raised to a new life with Jesus.



Being washed or cleaned is also a symbol for having sins removed. Psalm 15.7_{NLT} says "Purify me from my sins, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow."

So why did Jesus get baptised? He did not have any sin to remove; He did not have an old sinful self to die to. He did it to show He was fully committed to God, and most of all, He did it as an example for us.


