2 Peter 1:4_{NLT} says, "And because of His glory and excellence, He has given us great and precious promises. These are the promises that enable you to share His divine nature and escape the world's corruption caused by human desires."

Did you get what that verse is saying? We can share God's nature – that is we can become like God, rather than naturally, selfish human beings.

In his book Steps to Personal Revival which is available for free from **steps-to-personal-revival.info**, the author, Pr Helmut Haubell, talks about using God's promises – Bible verses – when praying, and especially making a point to pray for the Holy Spirit to work in our lives, claiming Luke 11:13 which says, "So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask Him."

Helmut Haubell, explains that Holy Spirit will influence every aspect of our lives. It will improve our relationships with the people around us, the Holy Spirit helps us to be kind and caring, rather than critical. The Holy Spirit will guide our plans, our choices, and our witnessing. The Holy Spirit gives us the Fruit of the Spirit.

Do you need help in any areas of your life? Ask for the Holy Spirit to work in your life and help with these areas and you will be amazed with what happens.

A Testimony:

My relationship with my father was always somewhat complicated. My wishes and prayers during my childhood and youth were always that I would have a better relationship with my father. But it got progressively worse. Another six to seven years went by. God filled the great emptiness in my heart. While studying and praying for the Holy Spirit my wife and I had a lot of big experiences with God. We prayed for our family and especially for my father. During this time, I received new power to love my father. I was able to forgive him for everything that hadn't gone well in our relationship since my childhood. My father and I are now friends. He also started to become more spiritual, and also started telling other people about God. Now, two years later, the relationship to my father is still very good. I thank God for this experience. I used to feel so powerless and often alone. But since I have started to pray daily for the Holy Spirit, I am experiencing a new and wonderful type of life and relationship with God.





Grow in grace and the fruit of the Spirit - 2Peter 3:18 and Galatians 5:22-23


