# Sunday



When the people saw him walking and heard him praising God they were amazed. They said, "Isn't this the lame beggar who sits at the gate?"


Then Peter took the opportunity to <u>tell</u> the people about Jesus.



What did the new church members do together?


Acts 1:14 says they met together and prayed together. Acts
