Now King Herod Agrippa arrested and killed the apostle James and when he saw how much this pleased the Jewish people, he also arrested Peter. It was the time of the Passover celebration, so Peter was placed in prison to await his trial.

The church was praying for him. The night before the trial, Peter was asleep; he was fastened with chains between two soldiers and more soldiers stood guard at the prison gate. Suddenly, there was a bright light and an angel of the Lord stood before Peter. The angel woke him and the chains fell off his wrists.

Then the angel said, "Get dressed and put on your sandals and coat and follow me,"

So Peter left the cell, following the angel. But all the time he thought it was a dream, he didn't realize it was actually happening. They walked passed the guards and when they came to the gate leading to the city it opened all by itself. Friday


Revelation 12:17 says that the **remnant** people, as well as keeping God's **Commandments**, keep or have the "testimony of Jesus." Today, we use the word testimony to mean an official statement, such as a statement submitted to a judge.

Isaiah 8:20 also speaks about a testimony: "To the **law** and to the **testimony**: if they speak not according to this **Word**, it is because there is no light in them." Isaiah is talking about comparing prophets with the Word of God – the Bible. The Bible testifies, or officially tells about, Jesus.

Testimony in the Bible means even more though. Revelation 19:10^{NIV} says "It is the Spirit of **prophecy** who bears testimony to **Jesus**." God's **Spirit** inspired the Bible prophecies, both before Jesus came and again after He left. On the day of Pentecost, Peter quoted from the prophet Joel, read what he said in Acts 2:17-21.

We can be assured that as we approach the end of the world, God has not forgotten us, we are not alone. God's Spirit is always with us to lead and guide us both as individuals and as a Church and thanks to God's **prophets**, we don't have to be afraid because we know what the **future** holds.



