



# Where is Jesus Now?



#### **Friday**

What do we know about the heavenly Sanctuary? Read Hebrew 9:1-14 then fit the bold words in the grid.

Jesus is our <u>High Priest</u>
Jesus death was the <u>sacrifice</u>
Jesus is <u>ministering</u> in the heavenly Sanctuary

In the earthly Sanctuary, most of the priests work was in the **courtyard** and in the first room of the Sanctuary. As **Jesus** sacrifice on the **cross**, took place on earth, the courtyard of the Sanctuary in the wilderness, may actually represent the **earth**. It was after Jesus returned to heaven that Paul wrote in Hebrews 8 about Jesus working as our High Priest, so the inside of the Sanctuary in the wilderness might represent something in Heaven.



Once a year, on the Day of Atonement, the High Priest would enter the Most Holy Place. The Day of Atonement is called Yom Kippur and was a time of Judaement and anvone who did not take it seriously would be destroyed (Leviticus 23:30) The judgement in heaven started in 1844: this is when Jesus began the work of the Day of Atonement in the Most Holy Place in the **heavenly** Sanctuary. (Dan 7:9-14; Rev 14:7)

Everything you do is recorded in Heaven. Make a list of some of the good and bad things you did today.



## Monday


By the time Moses was born, most of the people on earth had totally forgotten about God and His plan to save them and those who hadn't totally forgotten didn't really understand either. After rescuing the Israelites from Egypt, God had to teach them all about Himself and His plan to save people from Sin. God gave Moses detailed instructions on how to build the Sanctuary, to teach the people about Sin and Silvation. He showed him what the Sanctuary was to look like, Hebrews S:SNLT says that "Moses was warned when he was about to build the tabernacle: 'See to it that you make everything according to the pattern shown you on the mountain."

Everything in the earthly Sanctuary was there for a reason:

- The table of shewbread taught about spiritual food
- The altar of incense represented prayer
- The clothing of the high priest can teach you many things about Jesus who is also called our High Priest
- The lamp stand teaches about witness and the oil is like the Holy Spirit
- The ark of the covenant teaches us about God
- Every single one of the sacrifices, services and special feast days had a special meaning to teach the more about Jesus, and the sacrifice that He made on the cross.

The Bible calls the earthly sanctuary and its services a copy or a shadow of the real ones in heaven and Jesus is called our High Priest. (Hebrews 8:5, 6)

The Sanctuary sacrifices pointed forward to Jesus death on the cross; and the duties of the High Priest in the Sanctuary, pointed forward to things Jesus has done and other things He is currently doing, in heaven.
