When my Grandmother first met Rovai at the Mission school at Rumba, Papua New Guinea, she thought he was the loveliest Christian – but he hadn't always been.

Rovai had been a very skilled devil priest and the people lived in absolute fear of him. In his devil house Rovai had 3 arrows from which poison dripped and if he decided someone was guilty of something, he would take some hair or something from that person and mix it with the poison. Then he would hide the mixture on the path and watch to make sure the victim walked over it. Three days later they would die – even if they didn't know they had been cursed!

Now it happened that one day Taroa, one of the Christian men from the Mission school, decided to take a shortcut through the bush which led to the path where Rovai was waiting for his next victim. Imagine Rovai's surprise when Taroa walked over the poison first - He did not know if the curse would work on a Christian.

But a greater shock awaited him for when he arrived back home he found his devil potion had dried up! The devils had deserted him; the God of the Christians really was stronger.

So Rovai went to the Christian school and sat in the haus-tok – a small roof with a log seat where visitors were expected to wait. Everyone knew who he was so they avoided him until Pr Tati (pronounced Tar-ti) came past and asked him "Yu laikim wonem? What do you want?" and Rovai answered "Mi laik Klisten! I want to be a Christian!"

Pr Tati didn't believe him; he had caused a lot of trouble for the school in the past. Later in the day Pr Tati came past and found Rovai still sitting there; again he talked to him but he still wasn't sure if he was for real. It wasn't until the evening when he came past again and sat down for a long talk with Rovai that he was finally convinced. And so, the former devil priest became a true Christian, and a valuable helper at the school.






Atonement is a really big
