Back when my brother and I were children, my Dad would receive his pay each week as an envelope of money. The first thing Dad and Mum would do, was to set aside one tenth as tithe and another tenth as offering. Then \$50 or so would be set aside for food and \$10 for fuel for the car with the remainder going into the bank as savings for big expenses, like the car insurance.

But one week several big expenses, including some unexpected ones had come up. Setting aside the tenth for tithe and tenth for offering as usual, they then set aside what was needed for the remainder of the unexpected bills. But that left only \$20 for food and fuel! Together they prayed, claiming the Bible promise \_\_\_\_\_...

The next day was shopping day and before leaving the car Mum prayed again. Her first stop was the post office where she had to send two long distance birthday cards – they had to be sent that day so they would arrive in time. That left nothing in her purse except one lone \$10 note.

Then she went to the grocery store and chose the food that we would need for the week. When the teller totalled it up it came to \$50 as usual. With another prayer, Mum opened her purse – and there she found that the \$10 note had changed into a \$50 note – God had performed a miracle!

Happily she paid for the groceries and putting the recept in her now empty purse, took them home.

God had supplied our needs – but it gets even better; after she put the groceries away she opened her purse to take out the receipt and found a new \$10 note in it! – Just the right amount that was needed to get the fuel we would need in the car.

When they heard this they were angry, and began shouting, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians! Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!"

Their cry was so loud that soon the whole city was filled with confusion; everyone rushed to the amphitheatre, dragging along two of Paul's friends from Macedonia. Paul wanted to go too, but the believers wouldn't let him.

It was more than two hours before the mayor was able to quiet the crowd. "People of Ephesus," he said. "Everyone knows that Ephesus has the temple of the great Artemis; no one can deny it, so calm down. Why have you have brought these men here? They have not stolen anything from the temple; they have not even spoken against our goddess. Then he dismissed them, and they left.

When the uproar was over, Paul sent for the believers and encouraged them. Then he said good-bye and left for Macedonia.

"Why ask me about what is good?" Jesus replied. "There is only One who is good. But to answer your question—if you want to receive eternal life, **keep the commandments**..."


"I've obeyed all these commandments," the young man replied. "What else must I do?"

God has promised to supply our needs, but what do we have to do? Keep reading to verse 33.


When we seek to put God first in our lives, He will look after us.




Satan had stirred up the silversmiths to cause a riot; he was hoping to kill Paul and his friends, and stop their missionary work.
