




would put some of the money in the king's box and the rest in his own pocket.

<u>Monday</u>


How did the people feel about Zacchaeus cheating and stealing money from them?

He stopped cheating and stealing, and tried to give back the things he had taken which he shouldn't have. But the people didn't believe him. They thought he would start cheating and stealing again.


Poor Zacchaeus, he was trying so hard to do the right thing and no one would believe him. He wished that he could see Jesus and tell Him how

We need to tell Jesus sorry when we do something that is wrong and ask Him to help us to do the right things.




<u>Sunday</u>

Follow the line to see how Zacchaeus saw Jesus




<u>Thursday</u>
