

<u>Sunday</u>


Joseph's brothers had sold him as a slave; he had had to work very hard for his new master, Potiphar, but he always did his work well. He was always kind and cheerful.

with no rain; crops withered and died, and the people became hungry. The king sent them to Joseph.




<u>Friday</u>

<u>Thursday</u>


Going to Egypt seemed like a scary and bad thing to Joseph, but God allowed it to happen for a good reason.

Here are some of the things Joseph might have used in his work.




<u>Tuesday</u>
