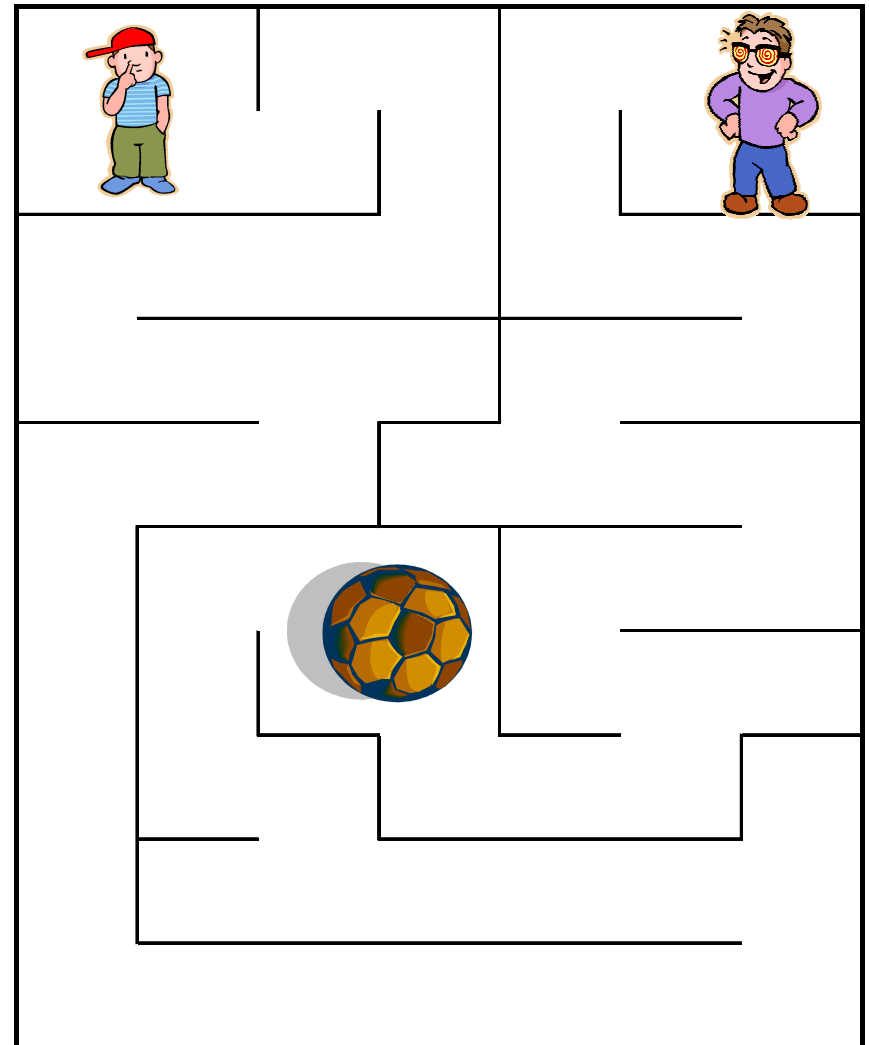
"Oh no," he cried "I borrowed that axe and I don't have any money to buy another one to replace it."



### Friday

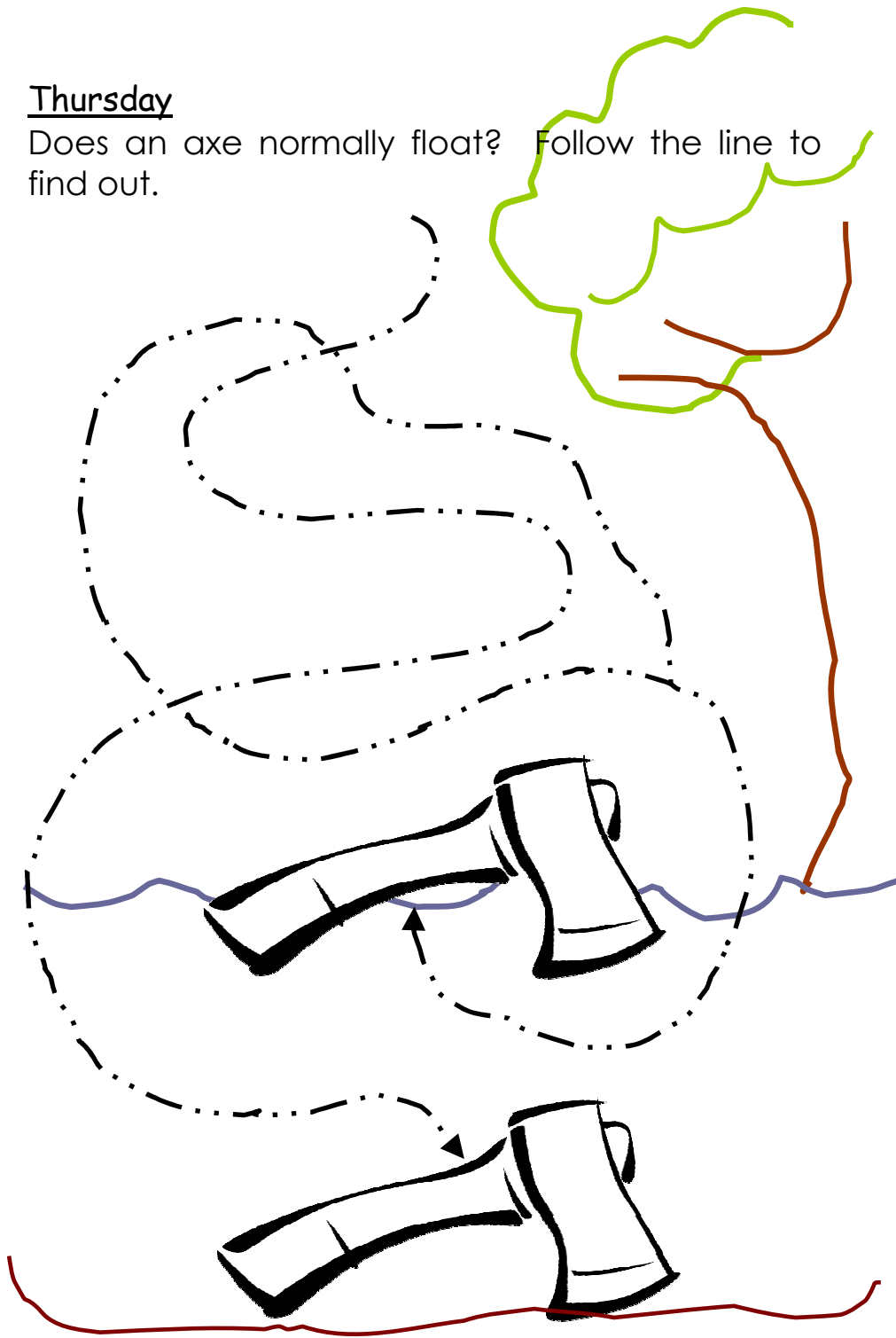
What should you do after you borrow something?

Jimmy borrowed his brother's ball, but he kicked too hard, and it went over the fence. Help Jimmy to find the ball and return it to his brother.



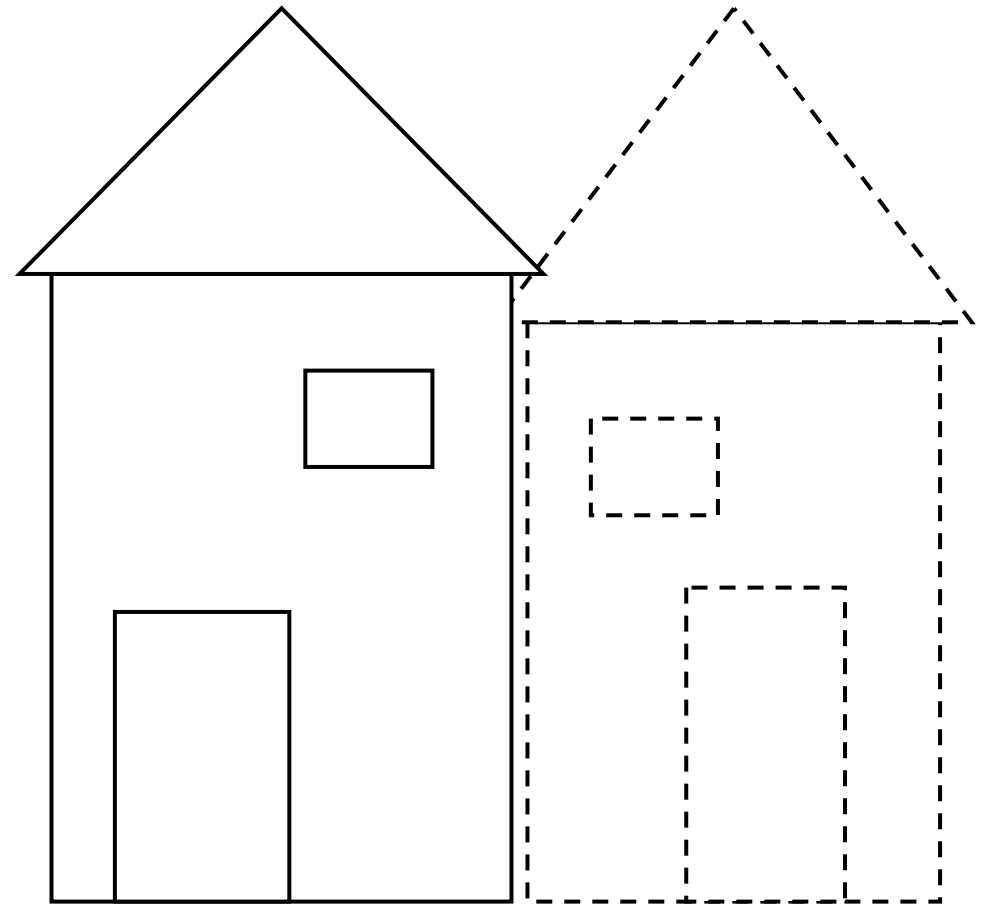
### Thursday

Does an axe normally float? Follow the line to find out.



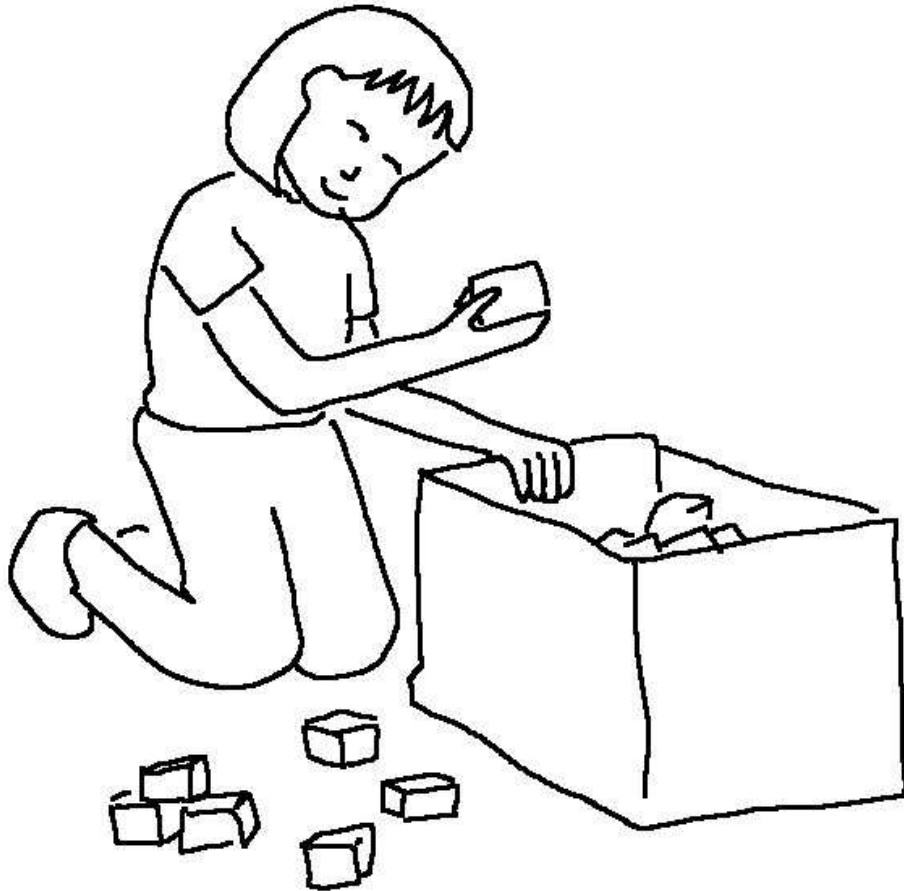
### Monday
