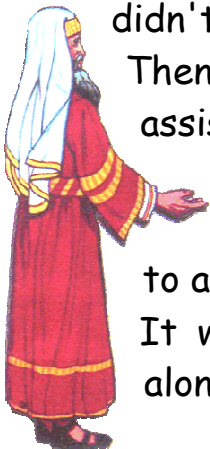

One day a man asked Jesus the question, "Who is my neighbour?" So Jesus told him this story:

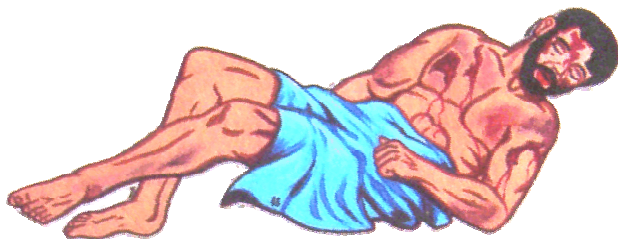
A Jewish man was travelling from Jerusalem to Jericho when he was attacked by some robbers. They took his clothes, beat him up and left him beside the road.

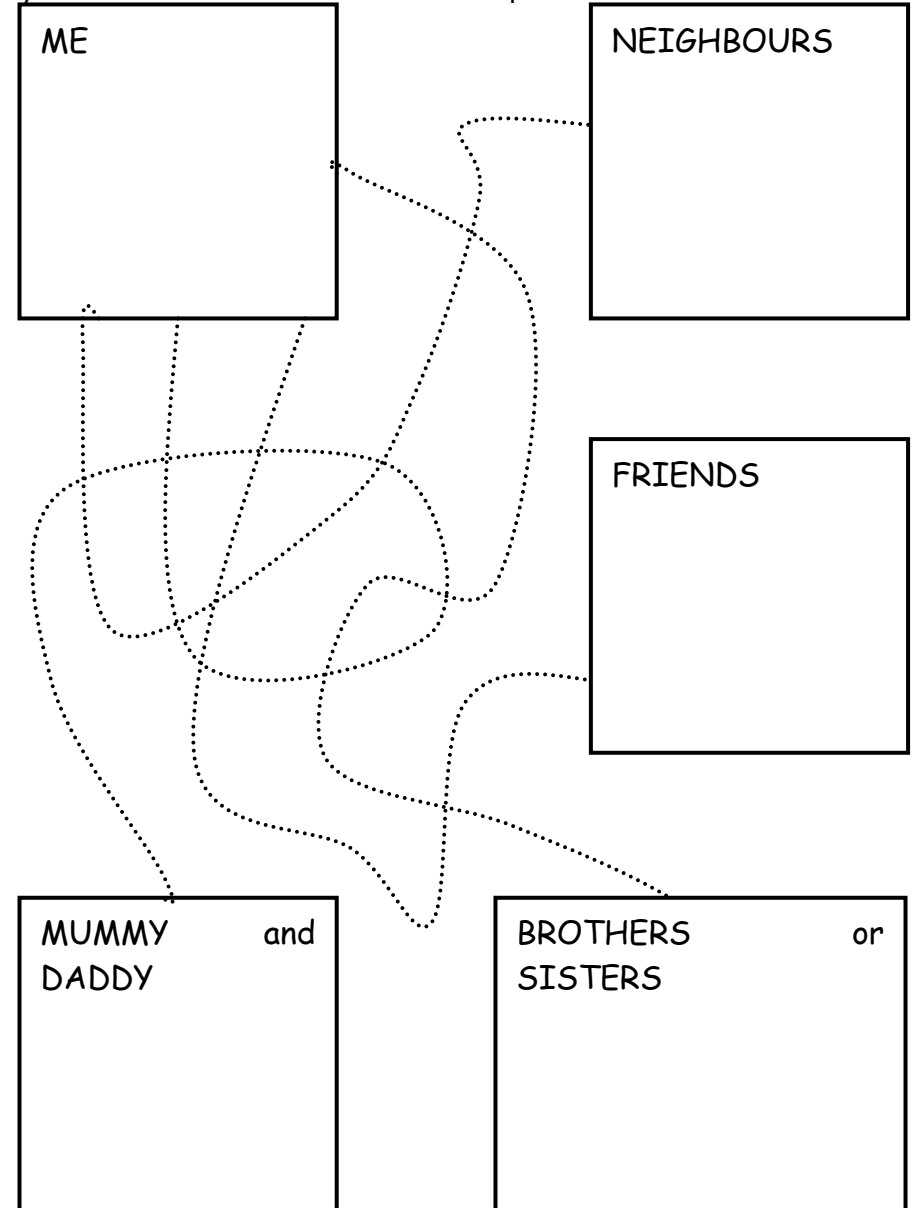
Then a Levite who was a temple assistant came along. He stopped to look but then he continued walking on his way. He didn't want the robbers to attack him.

It was a Samaritan man who finally came along and helped the man.



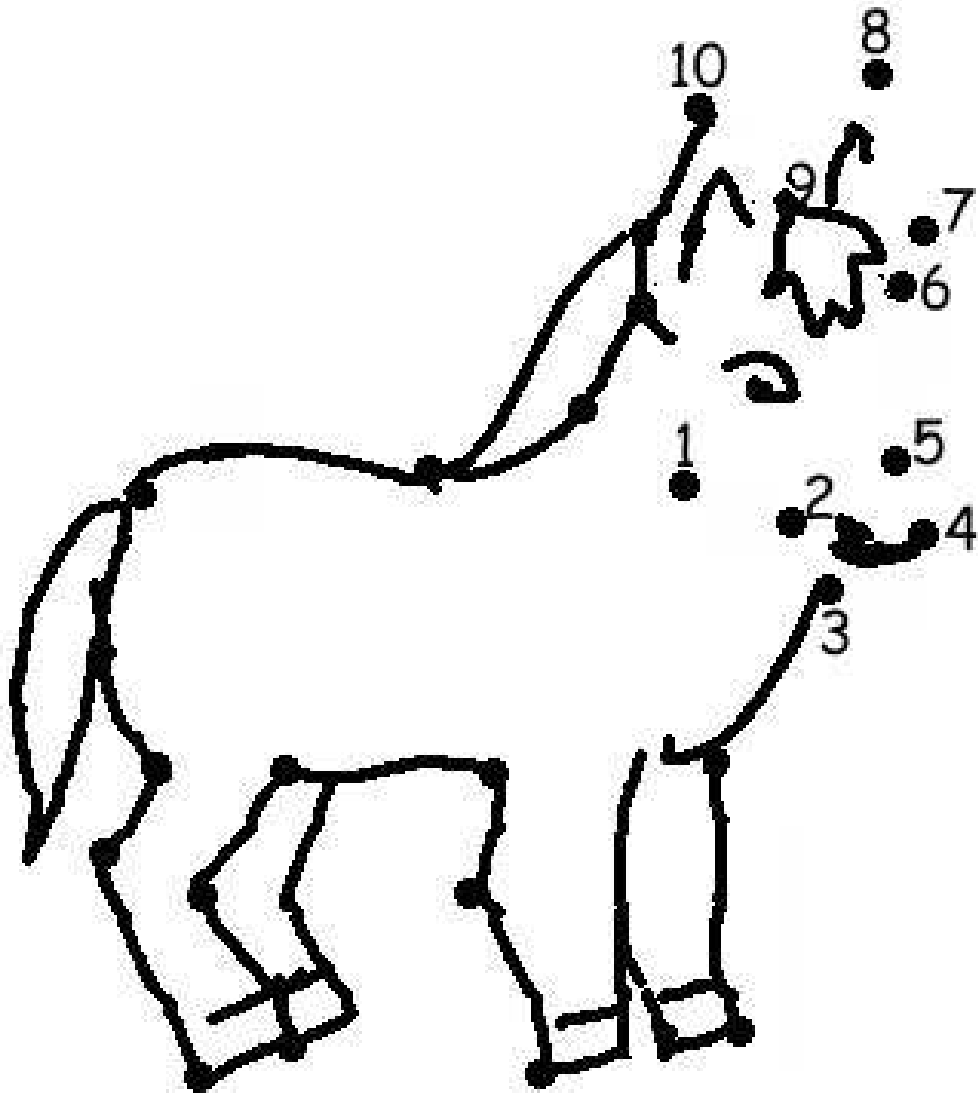
## Friday

Draw the pictures and follow the lines to see who you should be kind and helpful to.



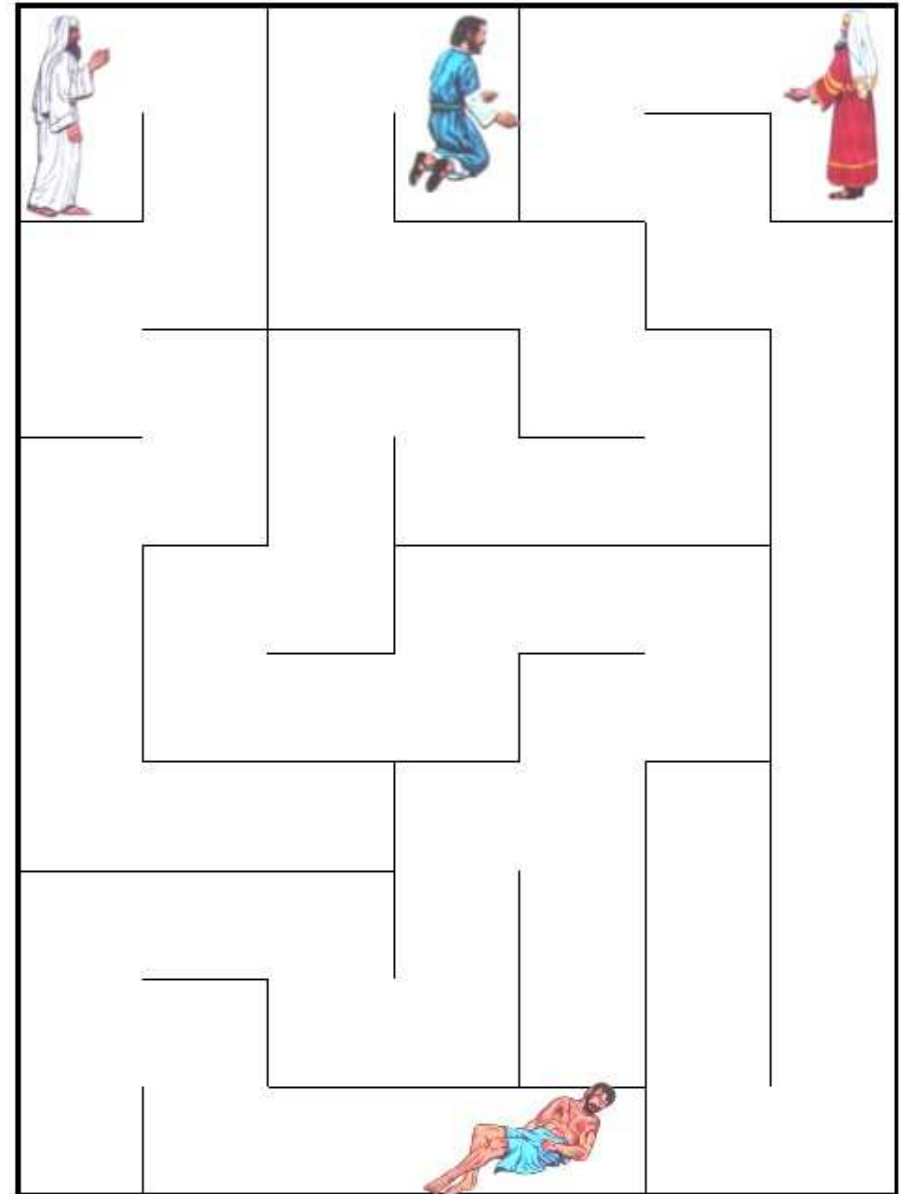
### Thursday
