

Christ, come out of her." Instantly, the demon left her and she was quiet.






Friday


<u>Thursday</u>

How did Paul and Silas get out of jail? Find a way from the jail through the maze to find out.




Monday

Why were Paul and Silas singing in prison? Who was with them? Use the arrows to join the dots to find out.




Tuesday
